

Attractions

Lisbon Riverside Tour

Discover the beauty and history of Lisbon's riverside in Belém. Explore the stunning Jerónimos Monastery and the Belém Tower, then enjoy a leisurely stroll along the scenic promenade by the Tagus River, taking in views of the Discoveries Monument and surrounding gardens. Don't miss tasting the famous pastéis de Belém, Portugal's beloved custard tarts, for a true local treat. Participate in a guided walking tour, or explore at your own pace.





Lisbon Historical Center Tour

Wander through the narrow, winding streets of Graça, Alfama, and Mouraria, soaking in the historic charm of Lisbon's oldest neighborhoods. See renowned sights like São Jorge Castle and Lisbon Cathedral, while your local guide brings centuries of stories to life. Stop at scenic viewpoints along the way to admire panoramic city and river views.







Oceanarium

Home to an astonishing collection of 8,000 different plant and animal species, the Oceanarium is a giant public aquarium dedicated entirely to oceans and their conservation.



Fado Experience

Immerse yourself in Portugal's soulful Fado music with an evening of live performance paired with traditional cuisine.

Visit the MAAT (Museum of Art, Architecture and Technology)

A modern, interactive museum along the riverfront, with architecture and tech-focused exhibits.



Benfica Sporting Museum & Stadium Tour

Discover the legacy of one of Portugal's most famous football clubs. Tour Estádio da Luz, home of the legendary SL Benfica Football Club and the largest stadium in Portugal.

Explore the Benfica Museum, where memorabilia, trophies, and exhibits capture the passion and history of Portuguese football. A fun, engaging outing for sports teams and fans alike.

Surf Clinic



Spend a day in the sun playing beach sports, swimming, and learning to surf! Catch waves along Portugal's stunning coastline with a beginner-friendly surf lesson. Experienced instructors guide groups safely, teaching the basics on gentle beaches near Lisbon. Sado Boat Tour



Set sail on a 3-hour boat tour through the stunning waters of Arrábida National Park. Cruise along the dramatic coastline, admire towering cliffs and hidden beaches, and keep your eyes open for dolphins in their natural habitat. This scenic adventure combines nature, wildlife, and unforgettable views of Portugal's protected marine landscapes.



Sintra Day Excursion

Step into a fairy-tale landscape as you visit the colorful Pena Palace and its lush gardens. Explore the charming streets of Sintra, then head to Cabo da Roca, the westernmost point of continental Europe. Stand atop dramatic cliffs overlooking the Atlantic Ocean, admire the historic Cabo da Roca Lighthouse, enjoy scenic coastal walks, and capture unforgettable panoramic views.









Algarve & Benagil Caves Adventure

Spend a night or two in the Algarve, famous for its golden cliffs, hidden beaches and crystal-clear waters. A highlight of the region is the Benagil Sea Cave, one of Portugal's natural wonders. Explore the cave by boat or kayak, admire its unique rock formations and sunlit opening, and take in the scenery along this stunning stretch of coast.





Benagil is a quaint fishing village. The village is small, with narrow streets, local cafés and beachfront restaurants, making it easy to explore on foot.

- Time out Market: a curated food hall with a focus on food stalls from various chefs
- LX Factory: a revitalized industrial complex featuring trendy shops, murals and cafés
- Praça do Comércio: a public square lined with shops and cafes
- Professional soccer match (potentially in October)
- Colombo Shopping Centre: one of the largest shopping centers in the Iberian Peninsula
- Visit Miradouros & Panoramic
 Viewpoints: Climb (or ride) to
 viewpoints such as Miradouro de Santa
 Catarina or Nossa Senhora do Monte
- Cultural Museum Visits: National Tile Museum, Museum of Art, Gulbenkian, etc.
- Day trips to nearby towns: Ericeira,

 Cascais, etc
